Guided tour of the art in the Metro



A journey in the Stockholm Metro is also a tour through the world's longest art gallery! Here you'll find fascinating art works, sculptures and a unique architecture, which we call cave stations. Join a guided tour through the art collection. Tours in English at 3 pm. All tours start from the SL Center on Sergels torg, in the ticket hall by T-Centralen station. The tour takes approximately one hour and is free of charge. No booking in advance is needed, simply turn up at the meeting place at 3 p.m. (Cost of the ticket: Free. All you need is a valid metro ticket.)

City Walk Old Town



A guide with historical clothes, meet you at Stortorget, outside the Nobel museum. Learn more about the city, people and buildings from the beginning of Stockholm until today. (Cost of the tour: € 17 / Kr 150. Ticket Purchase: Stortorget, outside Nobel museum. Address: Stortorget old town 11129 Stockholm)

Boat Sightseeing with Strömma



There are many tours to choose. Most tours are given in Swedish and English only. Other tours are also given in German, Russian, French, Spanish, Italian, Finnish, Chinese, and Japanese. Hop On Hop Off is a flexible way to see Stockholm from the water. The ticket is good for an unlimited number of trips over a 24-hour period. It can also be combined with bus (Open Top Bus Tour). Archipelago Race is for those who want to see the archipelago but do not have much time. In a fast Speedo boat, you get a feel for the archipelago and its 30,000 islands in less than 2 hours. 
